Academic Metrics

Graduate Success Rate (GSR) - tracks the graduation rate of students receiving sport-based financial aid over a six-year period.

Students can be removed from the cohort if the athlete leaves the programs before they graduate AND before the student exhausts eligibility (i.e. they go pro or they will transfer for more playing time) as long as they leave NCAA eligible

Academic Progress Rate (APR) tracks the academic performance of student-athletes per semester, giving credit to the institution for each student-athlete in good academic standing.

As with GSR, a player does not count against the score if the student-athlete in question was in good-standing at the time of leaving and there is evidence they left for an exception reason (professional sport roster, transfer to 4-year institution)

NCAA member institutions at the DI level must maintain a 930 APR score

PUBLIC SESSION

The Athletics Committee of The Ohio State University Board of Trustees convened on Wednesday, August 20, 2025, in person at Longaberger Alumni House on Ohio State's Columbus campus. Committee Chair Gary Heminger called the meeting to order at 7:59 a.m.

Item for Discussion:

1. Athletics Director's Report: Senior Vice President and Wolfe Foundation-Eugene Smith Endowed Athletics Director Ross Bjork reflected on accomplishments across the Department of Athletics over the past year. Ohio State athletics finished No. 8 in the Director's Cup standings and had its best year on record in terms of academics, fundraising, sponsorships and merchandise sales. The department has undergone an effectiveness review, which resulted in a restructuring as well as the creation of two new entities: the Center for Sports Intelligence and Strategy, and a data analytics unit. The department continues working to implement the terms of the *House* settlement and find innovative ways to adapt and lead in the changing landscape of collegiate sports.

Item for Action:

2. <u>Approval of Minutes</u>: No changes were requested to the May 15, 2025, meeting minutes; therefore, a formal vote was not required, and the minutes were considered approved.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

It was moved by Mr. Heminger and seconded by Mr. Kaplan that the committee recess into executive session to discuss business-sensitive trade secrets and to discuss personnel matters involving the appointment, employment and compensation of public employees.

The committee entered into executive session at 8:05 a.m., and the meeting adjourned at 9:48 a.m.
